As Paul says in his President's note, Lisa was superb in *Tell Me On A Sunday* - a one-woman show supported in parts by the backing singers. She told the story, in song, so very well and it was certainly a bit of an emotional roller-coaster of a story! The second half was fabulous, starting with Sarah McDowell on her cello with *Variations 1-4*. This is a wonderful piece of music; originally written by Paganini and adapted by Andrew Lloyd Webber for his brother, cellist Julian, to play. Then followed a selection of songs from various Andrew Lloyd Webber musicals, interspersed with some chat from Lisa about ALW and the shows the songs are from. There were solos, duets, trios and for the finale - *Love Changes Everything* with Lisa and our backing vocalists in harmony. A great ending!
