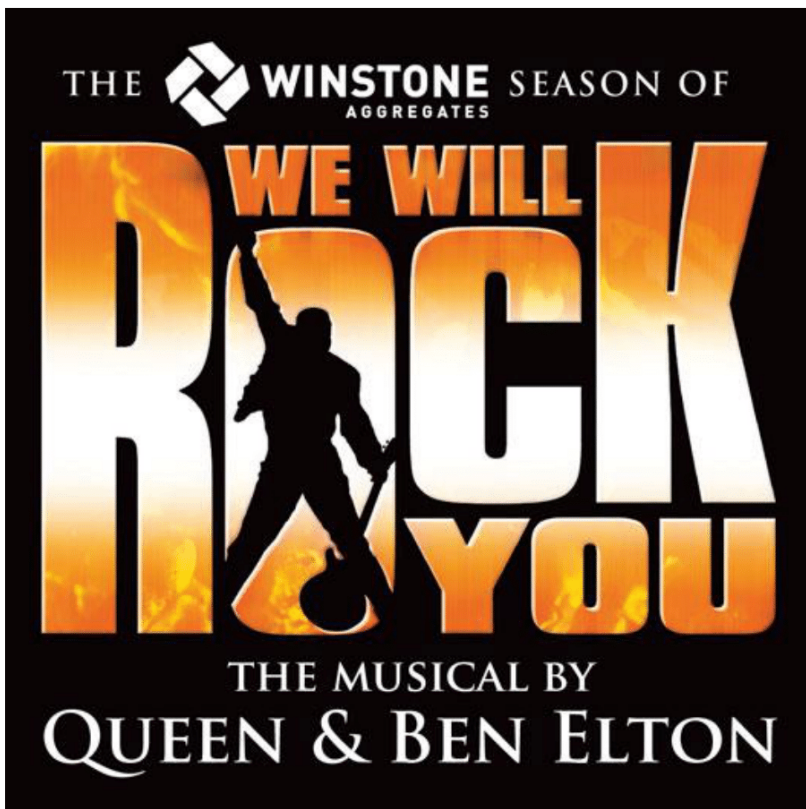
We recently held another garage sale of clothing and I would like to thank Judy Wilson and her team for organising this event.

BRIEF NOTES FROM THE PTC AGM HELD ON SUNDAY 21ST APRIL AT 7.00 pm

President Paul welcomed everyone to the meeting - pleasing to see such good numbers at our AGM.



Following the reading and adopting of last year's AGM Minutes, Paul presented his 2023 President's Report, which is attached. Treasurer Marie then presented her financial report which showed our Club is in a reasonably healthy position.

The election of officers was then held with Paul Radden being re-elected unopposed as President. All of the previous year's committee were elected together with the three members who were co-opted to committee last year. The motion was then put to the meeting and carried that the three co-opted members be given full voting rights as committee members. This needed to be done as under our current Constitution it appears that co-opted members may not vote – a grey area from an out-of-date document! (The planned revision of the Constitution will take this into consideration.) The 2024/25 committee is listed at the end of this edition.

The motion was put to ask our current Patrons Bruce & Jessie Pulman if they would like to continue in this role. Carried. Paul will talk to Bruce & Jessie about this.

Our Constitution is being updated – this project is being led by committee member and lawyer Cheryl Simpson. Once a final draft is completed a Special General Meeting will be called to present the updated Constitution to PTC members who will then be asked to vote as to whether it is adopted.

At the end of general business Barb was invited to present a citation and a motion that the meeting approves the awarding of PTC Life Membership to Rita Stevens. **Carried Unanimously!** Paul then presented Rita with her Life Membership pin. Congratulations Rita – you have earned this for your loyalty and hard work!

Meeting was followed by supper and refreshments.

MEMBERSHIP OF PTC – What it means and what you “gets for yer money”

Currently Membership of PTC costs \$30 for Adults, \$45 for a family (this can be 2 adults/2 children or 1 adult/3 children) and \$15 for a child at school

Being a financial member of any club (and yes, pretty well all clubs require a membership fee) means you “belong”. It means you support that club and are part of it. There are usually personal benefits to being a member but also the club benefits in having you as a member, both from your membership fee and from your interest and participation in club activities.

A club, any club, is somewhere you can follow your interests, make new friends, a place to relax and often expand your skills and knowledge – all benefits to you personally.

The benefits you get at Papakura Theatre Company for your membership fee are:

- Membership prices at the club bar (membership card must be presented)*
- 3 free drinks per member or 5 free drinks for a family membership
- Early notice of auditions
- Early advice of PTC shows to allow you the best choice of seats and/or the opportunity to organise yourself a group booking (bookings of 10 or more attract a 10% discount)
- Regular social nights at Off Broadway
- Regular newsletters and emails keeping you informed as to what PTC is up to, what’s on around Auckland, news of our members etc. Contributions to this publication are always welcome from everyone.
- Discounted rate for hire of Off Broadway (conditions apply)
- And most importantly, membership entitles you to the right to vote at the PTC AGM, meaning you can play a part in the running of the club.

Membership fees for any club help towards the administration costs and all the other expenses incurred in running any club, things like power, water, toiletries, insurance, repairs and maintenance, fees to “umbrella” national associations (in our case MTNZ), to our body corporate and so much else – so all financial contributions by way of fees are valued.



We get many comments from visitors to our theatre about how warm and friendly they find us and our theatre. That’s something to be really proud of!

So why not “belong”?

If you receive this newsletter and aren’t already a financial member but would like to join, membership forms are online at www.ptc.org.nz and fees can be paid with online banking, or you may like to pop down to Off Broadway when open and pay by eftpos and complete a membership form whilst there.

PTC has survived through thick and thin for 70 years – let’s make sure we keep it going so that future generations can enjoy the excitement of live theatre and hopefully get to celebrate PTC’s centenary!
