Tim Firth's hilarious play is based on the true story of eleven W.I. members who famously posed nude for a calendar to raise money for the Leukaemia Research Fund in 1999.

When Annie's husband John dies of leukaemia, she and her long-standing best friend Chris resolve to raise money for a new settee in the local hospital waiting room. With varying levels of encouragement, they persuade fellow members of the Women's Institute (W.I.) to pose nude with them for an "alternative" calendar. This is much to the horror of their local W.I. chairman, Marie. The success of the calendar goes beyond their wildest dreams and they soon raise the money needed and much more. With success however comes challenges, with Chris and Annie's friendship being put to the test under the strain of their new-found fame.

The play follows the experiences of six of the calendar girls, exploring their different motivations for participating, often with hilarious exchanges but also some very sobering realities of life.

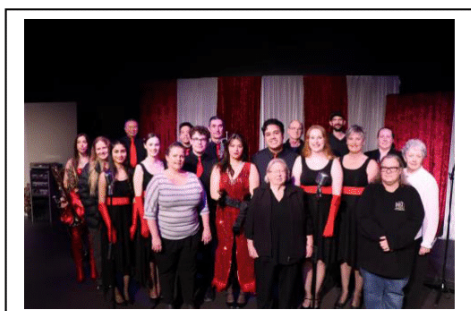

Each year MTNZ invites societies to put forward their nomination for the MTNZ Merit Award and your committee decided they would like to acknowledge President Paul Radden with this special award.

Here's an excerpt from nomination sent to MTNZ:



Paul has been involved in musical theatre since he was around 13 years old. He has played in show orchestras around Auckland and has been Musical Director for many and found instrumentalists for other MDs. Paul encourages young musos by bringing them into his bands and orchestras to play alongside more experienced players, thus building confidence.

Approximately eight years ago he formed the Off Broadway Big Band which is now recognised and acknowledged locally and at other venues around Auckland.

Since becoming PTC President in 2019 Paul has led from the front – always encouraging our team to do their best and try new things. He is caring and generous as a person and as President and he never fails to thank people for their efforts. He came into his element when Covid-19 struck and our theatre had to close during the lockdowns. When we were able to re-open Paul put in measures to keep both our cast and crew safe as well as our audiences. Although we did operate with reduced “socially distanced” audiences, with Paul’s measures in place we were able to keep our shows going and PTC survived the epidemic and in fact came through in reasonably good shape.

Paul didn’t attend Conference but we were pleased to surprise him with his Merit Award at supper on Opening Night of **Noises Off**.

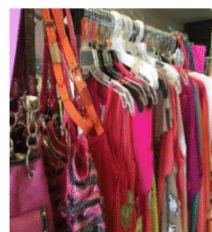
